THE NAAIB CONDEMNS ATTORNEY GENERAL KING'S HATE CAMPAIGN AGAINST PEDOBEAR

NAAIB Chairman Smokey the Bear Demands Apology

(ALBUQUERQUE) --- The National Association for the Advancement of Imaginary Bears (NAAIB) condemns Attorney General King's ongoing hate campaign directed at Pedobear, the well known good humored furry Internet meme bear. NAAIB has scheduled a protest for Wednesday, December 7, 2011 at 2 p.m. at the Attorney General's Albuquerque office to deliver a petition demanding King apologize and stop his hate campaign against imaginary bears.

Background

Attorney General Gary King recently launched an unprecedented attack on a member of the imaginary bear community, Pedobear. King declared that the "seeming innocent Pedobear menace" is the single biggest threat facing New Mexico's children.

King boasts that his top Pedobear investigators were able to document, not one, but two Pedobear stickers on vehicles in the Albuquerque area! King concluded that the furry bear stickers "were irrefutable evidence of increased child sex offender

activity in the area.” His team immediately put out an emergency bulletin alerting the public to the “PedoBear Menace” lurking in its midst.

In seeking to reassure the public King thundered, “I will devote every last resource at my disposal to fighting the Pedobear scourge flourishing in New Mexico. Mark my words, I will ensure that New Mexico is cleansed of every last fuzzy brown bear sticker that could (or could not) be attached to a vehicle or I will die trying.”

King concluded from his years of experience as the state’s top law enforcement officer that its common child molester practice to use highly recognizable cartoon symbols to align themselves with each other, despite the fact it makes them more readily identifiable to the general population and to law enforcement.

King said, “It’s a long standing practice, of course, for child molesters to advertise to the public and to law enforcement the fact, that, they are, in fact, child molesters. Basic stuff. Law enforcement 101.”

In response to the Pedobear menace, King channeled his inner Gov. Chris Christie declaring that New Mexicans better “Get the hell of the streets” and ordered the State Police to round up all woman and children and quarantine them until King and his team of Pedobear Special Agents had cleansed the area of every last fuzzy bear sticker.

King strongly advised that if one were to encounter a fuzzy bear sticker, “they should immediately retreat to a safe location and, then and only then, immediately report the sighting to the Attorney General’s Pedobear Menace Special Agent Response Team.”

King cautioned that only the most highly trained Pedobear Special Agents are qualified to handle the extremely dangerous situation of being in close proximity to a car with a fuzzy bear sticker on it.

“Trying to be a hero is how people get hurt,” said King. “Leave dealing with the fuzzy bear sticker menace to the experts. That’s why we are here. That’s why you elected me Attorney General of the great imaginary bear hating state of New Mexico,” says King.

Response from Chairman Smokey and Other NAAIB Members

“The only thing that makes me more angry than preventable forest fires is baseless uniformed attacks on imaginary bears. As a Native New Mexibear, I’m extremely disappointed in the Attorney General. His father was a friend of imaginary bears. If imaginary bears could vote, I would have voted for Mr. King’s father three times,” says NAAIB Chairman Smokey the Bear.

Smokey added that: “King won’t pursue political corruption cases. And has completely bungled the few slam dunk cases he has pursued. He could care less about Medicaid fraud. He flagrantly violates campaign finance laws and the Inspection of Public Records Act. Both of which he is tasked with enforcing. What does he do instead? He devotes his office’s resources to investigating, slandering and inciting vigilantism against imaginary bears. This campaign against Pedobear is nothing more than a thinly veiled effort to distract the public from his failed record as Attorney General. Plain and simple.”

The Imaginary Bear Chapter of Think New Mexico recently issued a report recommending raising the minimum qualifications for future Attorney General candidates on the ground that doing so would reduce the likelihood of electing such a complete moron.

The current head of the Imaginary Bear Chapter of Think New Mexico, the Silver and Grey La Cueva High Bear Mascot adds that, “This incident is a perfect example of why New Mexico needs to raise the minimum qualifications for the office of Attorney General. Not only should they be required to be a licensed attorney, they also should be required to demonstrate a proficiency in performing a simple Google search before issuing a press release. At the very least, future AGs should be required to take at least 4 minutes of continuing education each year on how to use Google. If anybody in the AG’s office had this skill maybe this nationally embarrassing incident could have been avoided.”

Tim the Bear (from the hit TV series The Cleveland Show) and an Emeritus Member NAAIB’s Board was also appalled at AG King’s baseless attacks on Pedobear.

“My wife Arianna and I were on set in Cranston, Rhode Island filming the next season of our show, when we read in the national press about the deplorable situation in New Mexico. Pedobear is a close friend of the family. To attack Pedobear, a bear that has devoted his entire life towards making fun of pedophiles,

as a danger to children, would be laughable, if it were not so sad and reprehensible.”

Tim the Bear added, “The producers of The Cleveland Show had been seriously considering shooting the upcoming full length The Cleveland Show Movie in New Mexico. New Mexico has great incentives and a skilled production staff. But given the AG’s imaginary bear hate campaign, we are going to have to relocate to a location more tolerant of imaginary bears.”

Arianna the Bear adds that, “This issue is so important to Tim and me that we stopped shooting the fourth season of our show and made plans to travel to New Mexico for the protest to show our solidarity with Pedobear. You attack one imaginary bear you attack us all.”

The elder statesmen of imaginary bears, Paddington the Bear, is gravely concerned about what these attack means for the direction of the country and stresses the importance of imaginary bears banding together in opposition to King’s persecution.

“I lived through the last systemic persecution of imaginary bears in the late 1930s and 1940s,” says Paddington. “I never thought it would happen again in my lifetime, it’s starting to look like history is repeating itself, a desperate political opportunist blaming imaginary bears in order to distract attention from his own shortcomings and societal ills.”

Paddington the Bear also stressed the importance of imaginary bear solidarity and offered the following piece of wisdom to the imaginary bear community.

“If we don’t stand up against the persecution of imaginary bears that poke fun at pedophiles. Who’s next? Imaginary bears that prevent forest fires? Imaginary bears who artfully swipe pic-a-nic baskets from unsuspecting campers? Imaginary bears who star on the Fox Network’s third rated Animation Domination TV show? If we don’t all stand together, when they come for you there may be no imaginary bears left to speak out.”

Other notable imaginary bears that plan to attend Wednesday’s protest are Baloo from The Jungle Book, the Bernstein Bears, Rupert Bear, and Winnie the Pooh.

At Pedobear's insistence, candy will be served to all the youngsters who attend the protest.
